While he was thankfully found safe and sound, we did have an anxious time before we located him. During that time, so many people from within our community stepped up to help. Students and families immediately came forward to help look for him and to spread the message around. On behalf of the staff, I would like to share a heartfelt thanks to you all.

While class teachers are often addressing the issues of what to do if you are scared, lost or lonely, you may wish to have a conversation with your own children to ensure they understand what they should do.

Yesterday our senior Deaf class took a long drive out to Byford for the day. While they were there, they participated in a number of very challenging events such as raft building and maneuvering across a rope bridge over water. I personally have done these activities before and can confirm, they are a test of courage. Our students were up to the challenges and gained confidence and resilience skills by conquering these activities. Team building and leadership skills were also put to the test and we are very proud of how our students managed.

It's hard to believe the term is disappearing so quickly, but next week it is already Easter time. We wish you a very happy Easter and hope you are able to spend some quality time with your families. Please stay safe and we look forward to seeing all of our students back at school on Wednesday 4th April

CYBER SAFETY AT MOSMAN PARK
