STUDENT ARRIVAL TIME

A number of students are arriving very early to school – well before staff. Students at school before 8.15am may not be adequately supervised and at risk of stranger danger, or accidental injury. Staff need to set up their own classrooms for the start of the school day and so are unable to supervise students who arrive early.

Classrooms generally open at 8.30am; students arriving before this should be seated in the undercover area, under the fig tree or on the verandah of the main building (not in the play grounds).

Families who are unable to care for their children before school starts can book into the YMCA Outside School Hours

Care which operates from the school library starting at 7am. Your support in this is greatly appreciated.

MEDICAL PLANS

If your child has a medical condition which may require medication and/or an individual medical plan, please let us know so that our records can be adjusted and medication stored. Please then provide the necessary medication (Ventolin, antihistamine, EpiPen etc) if you believe your child's condition warrants it. Please take note of the expiry date to ensure that the medication remains up to date. In addition, a doctor's medical plan would also ensure we respond correctly should your child have a medical emergency. Please bring these to the front office so we can store them centrally. In an emergency, when the medication is in a child's bag, it takes vital minutes to find your child's bag and locate the medication. Some medications are also temperature sensitive. Central storage means that the medication is readily available for class teachers, duty teachers and to take on excursions. If your child requires short term medication, we will need you to fill out a form to allow the front office to store and medicate during the day. These medications can't be stored in the classroom or administered by class teachers. Updating all contact details regularly is also important so that you can be contacted easily in the case of an emergency.

ICAS TESTING

The University of New South Wales is offering your child an opportunity to participate in the International Competitions and Assessments for Schools (ICAS). ICAS assessments have taken place annually in schools for over thirty years and in 20 countries. Educational Assessment Australia (EAA) design and deliver the assessments and is an arm of the University of New South Wales. Please be aware that these assessments are competitively based and may be conducted before school. They are conducted in September.

As entries are administered through the school, you can apply through the school by filling out and returning with

payment the form held at the front office. Please return the form to the School Administration before 11 March, 2019 – Late entries will incur extra costs.

CAT or AMC MATHS TESTING FOR YEARS 5/6

Registration for all Australian Mathematics Trust competitions has now opened! Computational and Algorithmic Thinking (CAT) is first up, scheduled for 2 April, and is available in paper or online format.

Students have an hour to complete the paper, which contains 9 problems that require logical and algorithmic thinking. This includes six multiple-choice questions that are relatively easy to solve, followed by three more challenging questions.

In 2019, the AMT is offering a package of the CAT and the Australian Mathematics Competition (AMC) for the discounted price of \$10 per student. Please fill in the same form as the ICAS testing and return to the office by 11 March along with the payment. Costs are non-refundable.

CANTEEN

Over-the-counter orders are still available in the morning, with canteen opening at 8.30am (cash only.) The canteen operates at recess and \$3 is usually enough for a muffin and an icy pole after lunch. Canteen volunteers are always there to help the little ones with the correct change.
