Welcome to Graeme – our Traffic Warden

We are really pleased to welcome our new Traffic Warden to the Mosman Park Primary School community. Graeme is on duty every morning and afternoon and helps our students and families to cross the very busy Victoria St.

We have spoken with all of the students about using the crossing safely. The most important thing to remember is to wait for the whistle to be blown before crossing. This ensures that all traffic is safely stopped



before the students start crossing. We have also reminded students who are crossing Victoria St to walk down to the crossing and not to try and cross at other points. If you are on a bike or scooter you need to dismount and walk across the crossing (they have asked us to make a particular point about this as walking the bike makes you a pedestrian rather than a vehicle). Graeme is really enjoying the job and is delighted with the friendly greetings that he is receiving.

APPLICATION FOR KINDERGARTEN AND PRE PRIMARY 2020

To enter Kindergarten next year, your child must turn 4 by 30 June 2020. Please note that families are only permitted to apply to one state government primary school.

SAFETY FIRST

At our Values Assembly we have been talking about our 5 Positive Behaviours. We have talked about Mutual Respect last term and this time we focused on our priority of Safety First. We thought about some incidences in schools where this was particularly important:



- Wet weather – taking care when it rains, avoid mud & puddles (near T12 which is currently cordoned off).
- Canteen- standing in the correct rows so that the 1-2s are in one, 3-4s in another and 5-6s in the final row. Teachers can then marshal students into empty rows to keep everyone safe. Students should also stand back from the student being served at the counter to give them room to step out of the way with their food. Square Ball games are banned in the undercover on Friday recess to avoid accidents with students in the rows.
- Fig throwing is prohibited
- Tackling games and Build Up are also banned as they are dangerous
- Play Ground Patrollers – Year 6 students in the onesies are there to support students in play but we also need to keep them safe – younger students are reminded not to jump on their backs
- If you see someone doing something dangerous - don't physically intervene. Ask them to stop or see yard duty teacher in fluoro vests
- Medical attention – band aids can be requested from duty teachers or for further help students should go to the front office - medical room
- Fooling around and making any sort of physical contact has the potential to lead to accidents or may cause a fight if someone doesn't like it.

And finally, students should not run or ride bikes/scooters through the built up areas in the main part of the school during the school day from arrival to departure.

COLD & FLU SEASON

TECH TALK

BINARY

Last week in Digital Technology, students were learning how to use the binary system.

The binary number system is a base-2 number system. This means it only has two numbers: 0 and 1. Computers operate in binary, meaning they store data and perform calculations using only zeros and ones.

How do binary numbers work?

Binary numbers only use the numbers 1 and 0. In a binary number each "place" represents a power of 2. For example:

$$1 = 2^0 = 1$$

$$10 = 2^1 = 2$$

$$100 = 2^2 = 4$$

$$1000 = 2^3 = 8$$

$$10000 = 2^4 = 16$$

Converting from Binary to Decimal

If you want to convert a number from binary to decimal, you can add up the "places" that we showed above. Each place that has a "1" represents a power of 2, starting with the 0s place.

Examples:

$$101 \text{ binary} = 4 + 0 + 1 = 5 \text{ decimal}$$

$$11110 \text{ binary} = 16 + 8 + 4 + 2 + 0 = 30 \text{ decimal}$$

$$10001 \text{ binary} = 16 + 0 + 0 + 0 + 1 = 17 \text{ decimal}$$

In some classes, students created binary bracelets and in the older years they made a Flippy Do. See if your child can teach you how to work out the binary code for a number.

HOPSCOTCH

Another great app that kids can use to learn to code and make games is Hopscotch! Your kid will never run out of ideas. As they become better programmers, Hopscotch will continue to inspire and challenge them to create increasingly advanced games and apps.




KINDERGARTEN ORIENTATION SESSION
