FROM THE PRINCIPALS

Novel coronavirus (COVID-19)

We are all aware of the current concerns regarding Novel coronavirus (COVID-19) and the impact that it may have on our schools in upcoming months. As a school we are following the directions and advice of the Department of Education (DoE). Our Department provides schools with regular updates regarding COVID-19 with all of their information and advice provided directly from the WA Department of Health.

While the Department of Health advises that the risk of transmission in Western Australia remains low; they are monitoring the situation and DoE are acting on their advice to take any necessary precautions for schools and staff. The current focus is on preparation in advance of COVID-19 and precautions that can be put in place to slow its transmission.

Attendance at school

Who cannot attend school: Students or staff cannot attend school and need to self-quarantine if they have:

- left or transited through mainland China in the last 14 days, they must isolate themselves for 14 days from the date of leaving mainland China;
- left or transited through Iran on or after 1 March, they must isolate themselves for 14 days after leaving Iran;
- left or transited through the Republic of Korea, on or after 5 March, they must isolate themselves for 14 days after leaving the Republic of Korea;
- left or transited through Italy in the last 14 days, they must isolate themselves for 14 days from the date of leaving Italy;
- been informed by public health authorities that they have been in close contact with a confirmed case of coronavirus, they must isolate themselves for 14 days after the date of last contact with the confirmed case.
- Students or staff who have been tested for COVID-19 should follow the advice of the Department of Health and stay away from school whilst awaiting results.

If a WA school has to close due to a confirmed case, it will be on advice from the WA Health Department's Chief Health Officer. In this situation the principal will receive direct advice and support regarding the closure process and communication from the coronavirus support team.

Preventing the spread of COVID-19

There are practical and proportionate steps that can be taken to prepare in advance of COVID-19 and precautions that can be put in place to slow its transmission. As a school we are implementing these measures and focusing on supporting staff and students to follow the suggested actions.

The Department of Health promotes regular and thorough hand-washing through:

- putting alcohol based hand rub (ABHR) dispensers in prominent places around schools/workplaces and make sure these dispensers are regularly refilled;
- displaying posters promoting hand-washing, see <https://www.who.int/emergencies/diseases/novel-coronavirus-2019/advice-for-public> or print the newsletter attachments.

Staff and students should:

- wash hands with soap and running water when hands are visibly dirty;
- wash hands with soap and water and use alcohol based hand rub (ABHR), before and after eating or prior to food preparation;
- wash hands with soap and water after going to the toilet;
- avoid using handkerchiefs;
- cough and sneeze with a tissue or bent elbow, dispose of used tissues immediately, and use ABHR or soap and water;
- avoid touching eyes, mouth and nose;
- wash hands with soap and water or ABHR when caring for the sick;
- if unwell, avoid contact with others;

NAPLAN ONLINE

Students in Yrs 3 & 5 will be sitting the NAPLAN tests this year. At MPPS, we will be sitting this test in a mostly online format. All tests will be done this way, except for the Yr 3 Writing which will be a pen and paper test held on the first Tuesday of NAPLAN (Tuesday 12th May). The national testing period is from 12-22 May. We will endeavour to have our testing completed earlier. There will be further information in coming weeks. Parents should also have received a pamphlet about NAPLAN Online by now. If you believe your child will need alternative testing conditions, or would be unable to sit the test due to medical/health reasons, please speak to your class teacher and applications will be given to you to sign if your child meets the criteria. Applications for adjustments must be received by the Department of Education by 22 May. Parents who object to testing may also fill in an application to withdraw their child from testing. Please see the front office or class teacher to collect the form for this. Students will also sit a practice tests between 23 March – 9 April to familiarise themselves with the format and to check for technical difficulties within the system. Additionally, the Yr 5s will sit a practice writing test on 23rd March (from 9am). Students and parents can also familiarise themselves with the tests by going online to the public demonstration site www.nap.edu.au/online-assessment/naplan-online/naplan-online-publicdemonstration-site
